Architectural Board of Review Members must be Qualified Electors* of the City or the County of Santa Barbara and possess professional experience in related fields, including, but not limited to, landscape architecture, building design, structural engineering or industrial design. Representatives must be from the following categories: Two members must be licensed architects and one member must possess professional qualifications.	3

Building and Fire Code Board of Appeals Members may be residents of the City or adjoining unincorporated areas of Santa Barbara County. Members shall demonstrate knowledge and expertise in specialty areas governed by the construction and fire codes of the City.	Open
Central Coast Commission For Senior Citizens Member must be a resident of the City.	1
Civil Service Commission Member must be Qualified Electors* of the City. Member may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government, and for one year after ceasing to be a member, shall not be eligible for any salaried office or employment with the City.	2
Community Development and Human Services Committee Members must be residents or employees of the following designated organizations, but need not be Qualified Electors* of the City. Members must represent one of the specified categories or organizations: Disabled Community, Downtown Neighborhood, Housing Authority, Latino Community, Lower Westside Neighborhood, and Youth Oriented Services.	6

Creeks Advisory Committee..... Members must be residents of the City or County of Santa Barbara and have some experience in ocean use, business, and environmental issues and provide community-at-large representation. One member must be from the Hotel/Lodging industry.	2

One member must be an active or retired police officer who is a member of the Fire and Police Pension System, who need not be a resident or Qualified Elector* of the City. One member must be a retired Firefighter.	
Harbor Commission	3
Members must be Qualified Electors* of the City.	
Historic Landmarks Commission.....	2
Members must demonstrate interest in and knowledge of the history and architecture of the City. Members may be Qualified Electors* of the City or County of Santa Barbara. One member must be a Licensed Architect and one member must be a Professional Architectural Historian.	
Housing Authority Commission	0
Library Board	1
Member must be a Qualified Elector* of the City.	
Living Wage Advisory Committee	2
Members may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government. Members must represent one of the following specified categories: Nominee of the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce or Santa Barbara Downtown Organization; and/or Owner/Manager of a Business within the City of Santa Barbara.	
Measure P Committee	5
One member of each of the following categories: Criminal Defense Attorney; Drug Abuse Treatment & Prevention Counselor; and/or Resident of the City and two members of Civil Liberties Advocate.

Neighborhood Advisory Council.....	7
Members must be residents of the City but need not be Qualified Electors*. One member must be of each of the following categories: Lower Eastside Neighborhood, Lower Westside Neighborhood, West Downtown Neighborhood, Eastside Neighborhood. Three members must represent the Public at Large. <i>Note: The Council may appoint youth members, ages 16 or 17; priority may be given to youth from the specified neighborhoods.</i>

Members must be Qualified Electors* of the City.

Members must be residents of the City or the County* of Santa Barbara and represent the following categories: Tenant; Landlord; Homeowner.	
The majority of members must be residents of the City of Santa Barbara. Non-City residents must reside in a jurisdiction which contracts with the Rental Housing Mediation Program for services. Tenants must be renting/leasing a dwelling, and have no ownership of residential properties.	
Santa Barbara Youth Council.....	5
Members must be between the ages of 13 – 19 years and may be from the City or County.	
One member must be from a Local Private High School; One member from Dos Pueblos High School; Two members from Local Alternative, Community, or Continuation High School; and One member from Santa Barbara High School.	
<i>Note: Of the 15 members, 8 must be residents of the City of Santa Barbara.</i>	
Sign Committee	0
Single Family Design Board.....	1
Member must reside within the County of Santa Barbara. Member must be a licensed landscape architect, and must possess professional qualifications in fields related to architecture, including, but not limited to, building design, structural engineering, industrial design, or landscape contracting.

Members must be residents of the City.	
Transportation and Circulation Committee	2
Members must be residents and Qualified Electors* of the City.

Members must be Qualified Electors* of the City.
