<u><b>ADVISORY GROUP</b></u>	<u><b>NUMBER OF VACANCIES</b></u>
Access Advisory Committee ..... Members shall be residents of the City during their terms in office. They shall have a demonstrated interest, experience, and commitment to issues pertaining to disability and access. One member from the Disability Community; three members representing the public at large.	4
Architectural Board of Review ..... Members must be qualified electors* of the City or County of Santa Barbara who meet either of the following categories: Licensed Architect, or Professional Qualifications.	3
Arts Advisory Committee ..... Members should be persons with acknowledged accomplishments in the arts, and persons who demonstrate an interest in and commitment to cultural and arts activities.	3
Building and Fire Code Board of Appeals ..... Resident of the City or the adjoining area of Santa Barbara County who demonstrates knowledge and expertise in specialty areas governed by the construction and fire codes of the City. Persons with physical disabilities are strongly encouraged to apply.	Continuous
Civil Service Commission ..... Member must be a qualified elector* of the City. Members may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government, and for one year after ceasing to be a member, shall not be eligible for any salaried office or employment with the City.	4
Community Development and Human Services Committee ..... Members must be qualified electors* of the County of Santa Barbara, or employees of the designated organizations. One representative from each of the following specified categories or organizations: Youth Oriented Services Organization; Eastside Neighborhood; Human Services Organization; Senior Community; Disabled Community; Homeless-related Services Organization; Oak Park Neighborhood; and Westside/Lower Westside Neighborhood.	8
Community Events and Festivals Committee ..... Members must represent the following specific categories: Business/Lodging/Retail Industry; and Cultural Arts.	4
Creeks Advisory Committee..... Members must be residents of the City, except for one. One member must represent the Hotel/Lodging Industry; remaining members may provide community at large representation.	4
Downtown Parking Committee..... Members may be residents of the City or the County, and shall demonstrate an interest in, and knowledge of, downtown parking issues.	2

Fire and Police Commission .....	2
Members must be qualified electors* of the City.	
Harbor Commission .....	2
Members need not be qualified electors* of the City as long as he/she remains a qualified elector of the County.	
Historic Landmarks Commission.....	1
All members shall demonstrate interest in and knowledge of the history and architecture of the City. Member shall represent the public at large.	
Housing Authority Commission .....	2
Members should have some interest and background in housing development, management, or other comparable experience. Tenant member must be receiving housing assistance from the Housing Authority, and must be over 62 years of age; public at large member may be a non-City resident.	
Library Board .....	2
Members must be qualified electors* of the City.	
Living Wage Advisory Committee .....	1
Members must represent specific categories. One member who is an owner/manager of a business operating within the City. Appointees may not hold any full-time paid office or employment in City government.	
Measure P Committee .....	6
Members must represent the following categories: One resident of the City; one criminal defense attorney; one civil liberties advocate; one medical marijuana patient; one medical professional; and one drug abuse, treatment and prevention counselor.	
Neighborhood Advisory Council.....	4
Members must be City residents and need not be qualified electors*. Majority of members must be residents of the following neighborhoods: Eastside, Lower Eastside, Westside, Lower Westside, and Laguna. The remaining members may represent the public at large, and need not be residents of the specific neighborhoods so long as they are residents of the City of Santa Barbara.	
Parks and Recreation Commission.....	1
Member must be a qualified elector* of the City.	
<u>For Youth Interns:</u> One youth intern, who is not a member of the Commission, shall be a high school student volunteer who resides within the Santa Barbara High School District or attends other high schools within the City limits and is nominated by the principal of the student's high school. The student shall be either in their junior or senior year of high school and shall be and remain a student in good standing as is determined by the high school. A student that graduates shall not serve for more than three (3) months following graduation.	
Planning Commission .....	2
Members must be qualified electors* of the City.

Rental Housing Mediation Board .....	5
<p>Members must meet the definition of the following categories: Landlord Mediator members must be a landlord who is a City or non-City resident and owns or manages residential properties for consideration or compensation, whether single or multiple units; Tenant Mediator members must be a tenant who rent or lease a dwelling with no ownership of residential properties; Homeowner Mediator member must own and reside in a single-family residence with ono ownership of other residential properties. Non-City residents must reside in a jurisdiction which contracts with the Rental Housing Mediation Program for services.</p>	
Santa Barbara Youth Council.....	5
<p>Members must be between the ages of 13 – 19 years old. Majority of members must be residents of the City. Other members may be residents of the County. Members must be students from the following schools: three SBUSD high school students (San Marcos HS, Santa Barbara HS, and Dos Pueblos HS); one member representing the public at large; one member who attends a local private high school or independent studies.</p>	
Sign Committee .....	1
<p>Member must be a qualified elector* of the City who represents the public at large.</p>	
Single Family Design Board.....	1
<p>Members must be residents of the County of Santa Barbara. One member must possess professional qualifications in fields related to architecture, including, but not limited to, building design, structural design, structural engineering, industrial design, or landscape contracting.</p>	
Transportation and Circulation Committee .....	1
<p>Member may be a residents of the City or the County of Santa Barbara.</p>	
Water Commission .....	3
<p>Members must be qualified electors* of the City.</p>
